SUBJECT: CDBG - End Hunger in Calvert County Warehouse - Second Public Hearing

Background:

In July 2019, the Calvert County Government was awarded an \$800,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) to support the construction of a 21,000 square-foot commercial-grade food distribution center in partnership with End Hunger in Calvert County, Inc.

Discussion:

Per the grant requirement, a second Public Hearing to provide the community with updates on the project's progress, as well as an opportunity for public comment, is necessary. The third Semi-Annual Progress Report, submitted to DHCD in early-January is attached for reference of the project's progress.

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Discuss grant progress during the reporting period (July 1 - December 30, 2020) and, if applicable, discuss any problems or challenges:

During the third six months of the grant period for MD-20-CD-21, the CDBG project for the construction of a 21,915 square foot warehouse building for use for End Hunger in Calvert County, Inc.'s food distribution program providing food to local food banks and programs in Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's counties, the following items have been accomplished:

- The COVID-19 pandemic created unique challenges in the community as social-distancing and prevention measures were implemented. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic beginning in March 2020, End Hunger in Calvert County redistributed energy to serve the hungry in Calvert County. In a temporary warehouse, End Hunger distributed, and continues to distribute, food and kid kits of shelf-stable kid-friendly food to families in need throughout the County. End Hunger distributed 434,444 meals since March 16, 2020. This program was done in partnership with Calvert County Government to address the increased need in food supportive-services as a result of COVID-19. End Hunger's staff had quickly shifted to telework to continue operating throughout the pandemic.
- After addressing COVID-19 concerns in early spring, fall 2020 brought progress for the End Hunger Warehouse project, as all permits and site plans were approved, contracts signed, and the project was ready to move forward.
- Construction officially began on Monday, December 14, 2020. Gradient Construction, LLC officially began construction on the warehouse site in mid-December. The contract with Gradient has a 180 day build clause, indicating that the building construction should be completed in summer 2021.
- Prior to construction, a debarment check was performed for SouthPaw Masonry (sub-contractor) and the addendum to the contract was submitted to DHCD. It was confirmed that there are no new hires for this project, no additional subcontractors at this time, and Labor Standards Posters were posted at the jobsite. An additional subcontractor might be used for the erection of the building, if this is to occur, an additional debarment check and addendum will be executed. The Community Resource Specialist's contact information is on the Labor Standards Posters to handle questions and concerns.
- Community Resources Specialist had a Davis-Bacon check in call with Gradient Construction to discuss payroll processes. A list of employees was provided to Calvert County Government and DHCD for review. First payrolls are expected in late-December or early-January depending on the holiday schedule.
- No beneficiaries were served during this time with CDBG funds, as construction has just begun. The first payment request for this project is anticipated to occur in early January 2021.
